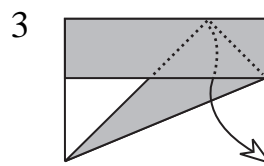
Here's an elegant envelope that will really fly through the sky... well, at least sail through the snail mail. The only problem is that it's from A4 paper. If you don't have A4 paper on hand, as most of us Americans don't, it's time you learned how to make it...



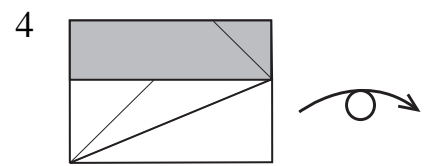
To make A4 paper, begin with an 11" square, white side up. Valley-fold diagonally in half. Then valley-fold the bottom edge up to the crease.



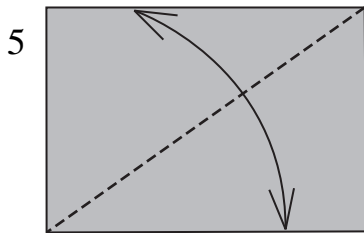
Valley-fold the top edge down.



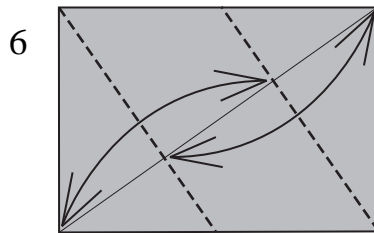
Unfold the bottom flap.



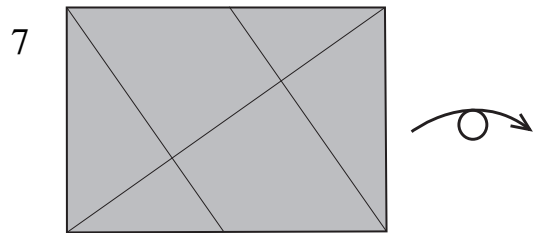
The A4 paper is complete. This is where you should cut off the shaded rectangle. However, if you are a stubborn purist, you can just pretend it doesn't exist. In any case, turn the paper over.



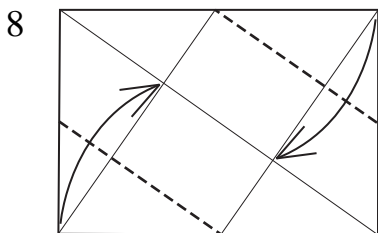
Now for the Envelope, Valley-fold diagonally.



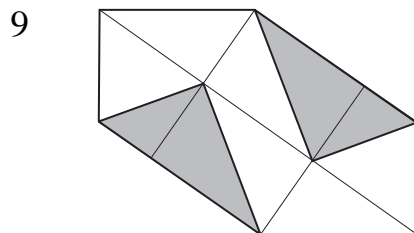
Valley, valley diagonalley.



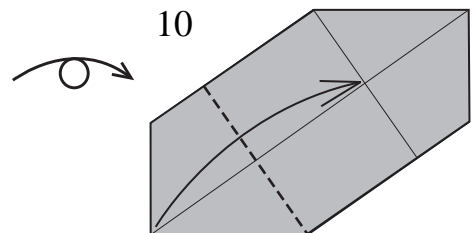
Turn over.



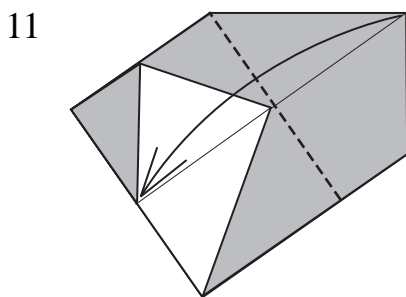
Diagonalley, valley valley.



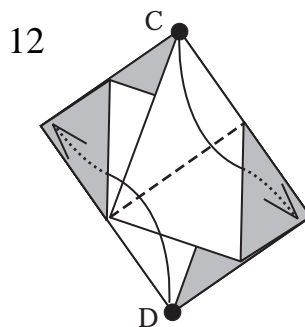
Turn over.



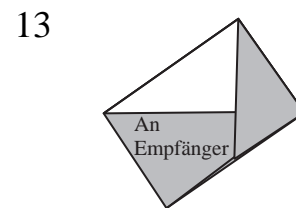
Valley.
