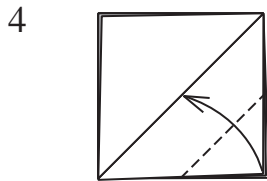
Welcome to Pure Land, home of the mountains and valleys. Valley-fold in half, top to bottom.



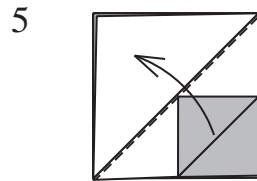
Valley-fold in half, left to right.



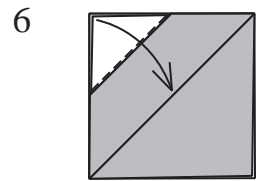
Valley-fold up one flap, preferably the top one.



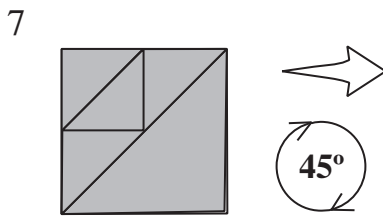
Valley-fold to the center. Exactly where is the center? Get used to it. This model is full of unguided folds.



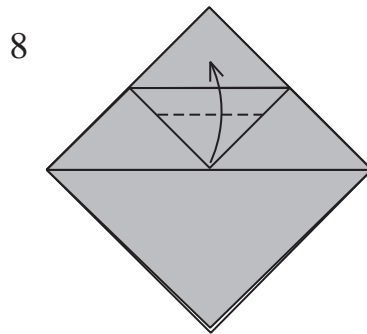

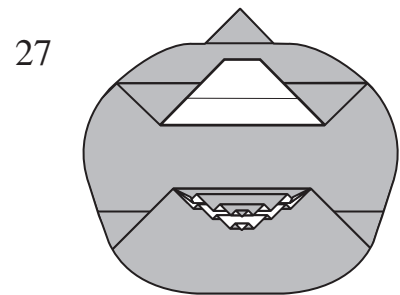
Pleat on top. Mountain-fold below.



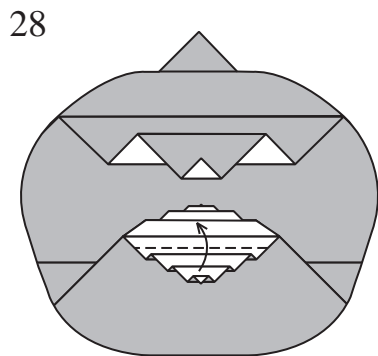
Round out the Jack-o-lantern to taste using mountain folds.



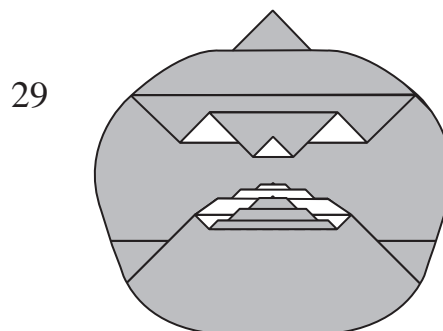
The Jack-o-Lantern is carved. To surprise it, swing up the top lip.
