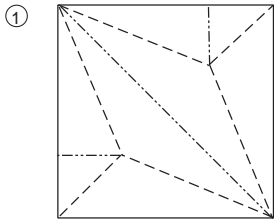
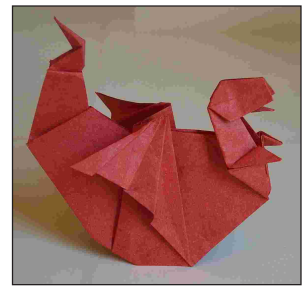
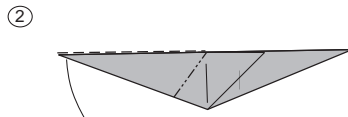


# Cartoon Dragon

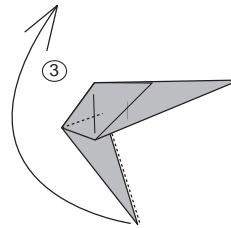

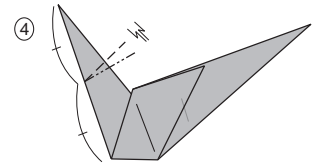
1 Fold into the fish base, as seen in next diagram.



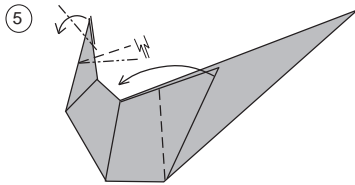
2 Reverse-fold the flap down.



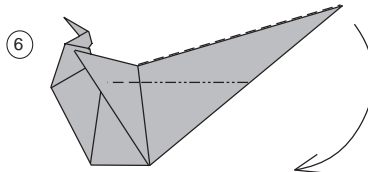
3 Make another inside crimp.



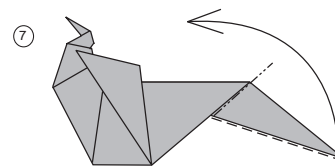
4 Crimp again.



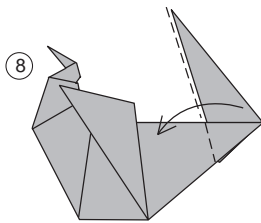
5 One more inside crimp fold and a simple reverse fold completes the tail. Valley-fold the flaps back a little more than half way to make the wings for your dragon.



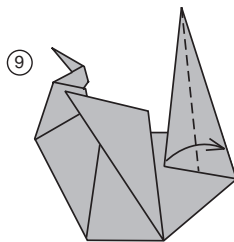
6 Note that on this reverse fold you are folding the down so that the mountain is parallel to the bottom of the model.



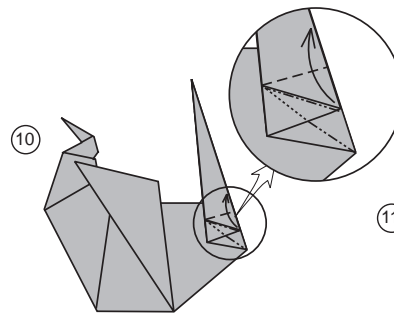
7 Reverse-fold the flap back into the model even with the edge of the body.



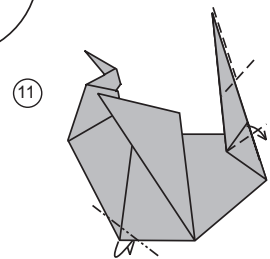
8 Valley-fold both sides



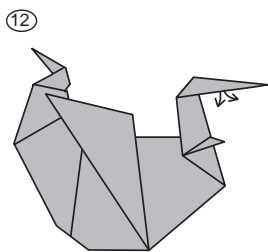
9 Valley-fold the top layer on both sides over so it matches the front edge.



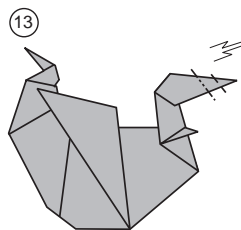
10 Half a petal fold.



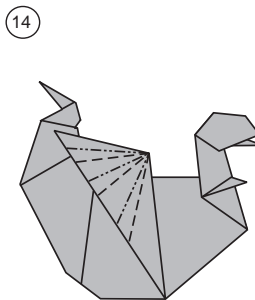
11 Mountain-fold a little of the bottom corner of the dragon's belly in to make it a little rounder. Then, to make the dragon's arms, valley-fold down the small flaps you made with the petal folds. Outside-reverse-fold the head.



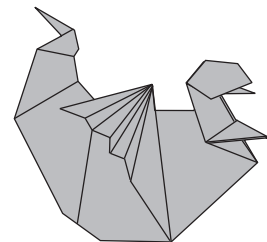
12 Reach up inside of the head and pull out the trapped layer to make the head larger.



13 A simple set of reverse folds to form the face and lower jaw.



14 All that is left is to pleat the wings!



And Voila! A dragon simple enough to teach to children! And it only took me two years of fumbling to find it! Enjoy!!!!
