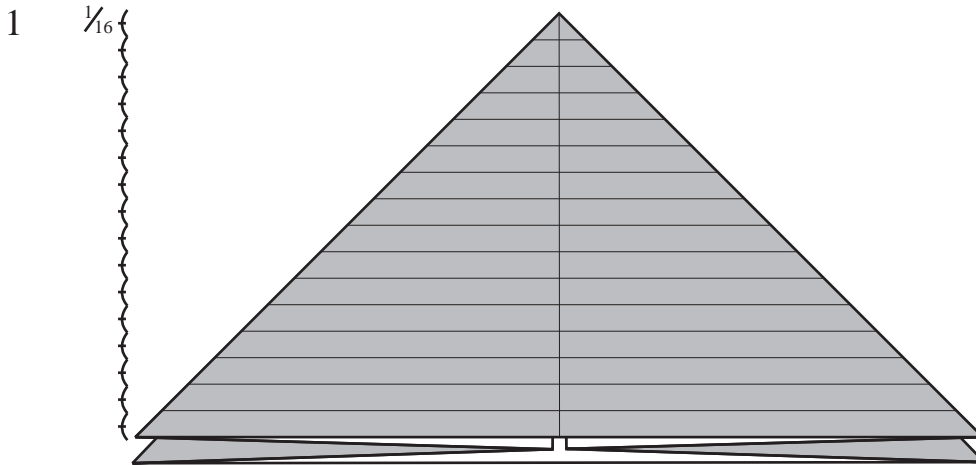
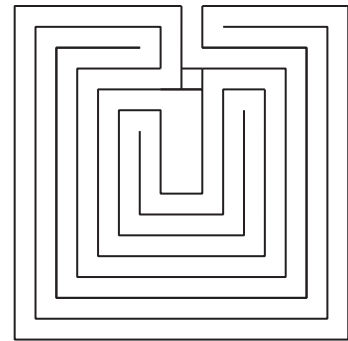


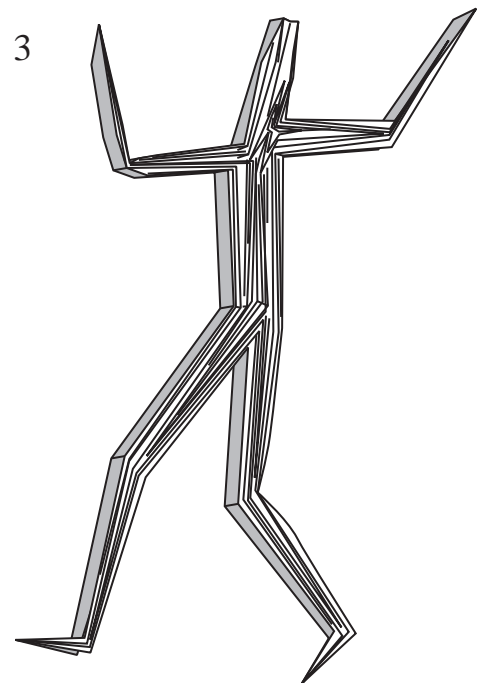
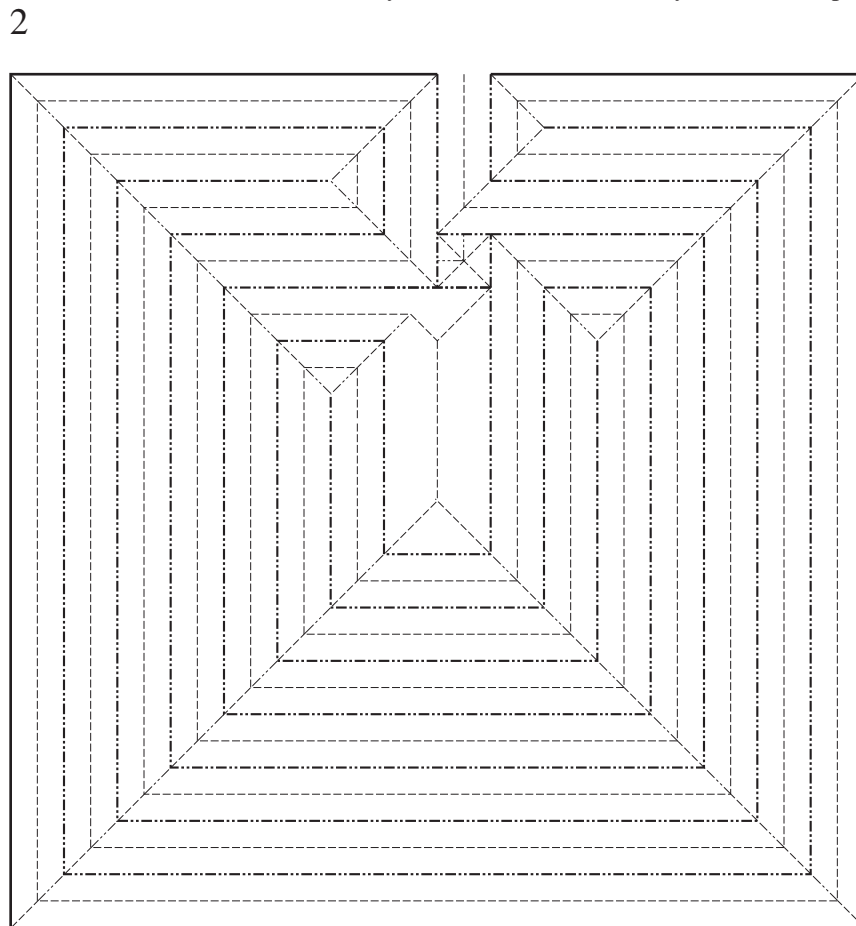
# Labyrinth Walker

On the outside, this model looks like any old box pleated stick figure, but inside it reveals itself as the classical labyrinth, which we can walk deep within and feel it deep within us.



Begin by folding a waterbomb base, colored side out. Divide its height into 16ths. It doesn't matter whether you use mountains or valleys. Then, completely unfold.



Make bends in the appendages as you see fit for a labyrinth walker. Now that all the folds have been made you can pull the model apart to reveal the labyrinth. Rest assured, putting it back together will be easier than before, for as a Zen master would say, "Once a labyrinth walker, always a labyrinth walker."

Using the existing creases as a framework, make the indicated folds.
